We still have another lovely blanket, handmade and donated by Aurelia Woodbeck, for \$50.00. Per Aurelia's request, the profit is for use in our outreach program.



A Short History of ROBO

ROBO (*Reaching Out Beyond Ourselves*) began in approximately 2004 crafting blanket squares to be made into blankets.

April Mohr (a former member of WUMC since moved to Tennessee), wrote "The program was originally spearheaded by a former pastor's wife, *Penny Johnson*. This idea for the square ministry (we call it ROBO which stands for Reaching Out Beyond Ourselves) began following a visit from *Marlene Taylor* who was the mother of one of our church family members. Marlene was born in Zimbabwe and lived there at the time our ministry began. She later immigrated to England. At that time, she felt she had to leave Zimbabwe for her own safety. The mission continued under the auspices of the Oasis Foundation with the squares assembled into blankets by Marlene Taylor's church in Harare." The blankets were then distributed to persons of need, usually children in the AIDES orphanage there. ROBO mailed over 180 pounds of squares and yarn to Zimbabwe continuing until postage costs became too expensive to continue.

The ROBO group then began making baby clothing to support *Carolyn's Place** in Waterbury. We also began hosting a baby shower on Mother's Day each year to support this local group. The next baby shower is planned for this May 9 during the regular Sunday church service.

More recently, *Evelyn Russo* learned of the world wide *'Dress A Girl' Program** which ROBO has chosen to support. Many children around the world (yes, even here in the U.S.) have little or no clothing. Girls, especially, are considered to be unworthy of clothing.

In addition, *Gloria Martin* from Florida has been making pocket size dolls to be placed in the dress pockets. Church family members, friends and others have donated cotton fabric and trims to support this program. We made 48 dresses which were carried by one of our church members, *Mark Newton*, to the orphanage in Haiti which he and a group of others established. *Nicole Novembre*, who attends church with *David Perkins*, took 55 dresses to Jubilee, Haiti where she and her husband lead a mission. Later she took another 86 dresses. The first dresses (11) completed were taken on a WUMC mission trip to Guatemala in 2017. Presently we have 180 dresses for which we are making plans to send with another Christian group, 'Serving in Jesus' Name' to Kenya.

The group meets nearly every Tuesday beginning at 11 AM to make dresses. Consider joining us. Skill in sewing is not necessary. For more information, contact Evelyn Russo at 203-592-9979 or Quiltermom5552@yahoo.com. Listed below are other resources for you as well:




