CAN I GET A WITNESS!

Greetings Friends,

As we prepare to move in the season of 2022, I pray that we will continue to focus on the transparency of the campaign Back to Church Sunday! This an ongoing process. We are called to be always a witness of our faith. Our Christian witness should not be limited to an hour on Sunday mornings when we gather for worship. Rather our worship on Sunday mornings should nurture, feed, and empower us to go out into the world to share the Good News. You have heard me use the term; church starts when the service is over. This is your opportunity to be that witness when you walk out the door on any given Sunday.

When Jesus commissioned the disciples, he did not encourage them to stay put and hang out with those who came to them. 

The Covid virus has made this past year another difficult one as we tried to fulfill our mission of support for our church, and expand concepts of mission locally and globally. Our U.M.W. is a small group, but always has the support of the church members when a project is undertaken so our projects are usually a success.

This year, due to the virus, we were unable to hold meetings in January, February and March. In April we were happy to get permission to meet in the church building where we could observe the requirements of a 6 ft. distance and the wearing of masks. We had a chance to bring our records up to date and make plans for the rest of 2021. *Aurelia Woodbeck*, one of our regular members, made two lovely white blankets and donated them to the UMW and specified that the profit go to the UMW to be used in our outreach program. The blankets were both sold and the money earmarked accordingly. We decided to ask members of the congregation to start sending their favorite Bible verses to *Pat Kurtz* so they could be posted prominently in the downstairs vestibule for people to see as the come in In May, we visited *Cricket Hill Gardens* in Thomaston to view their large display of prize Peonies. Four ladies took advantage of this pleasant outing.

For Mothers' Day in May, we had planned our annual outreach project for a baby and youth shower for the benefit of Carolyn's place in Waterbury. Church members always join us in donating gifts for babies and older children. Although his date had to be postponed until October, it was still a success. A luncheon at Mangia's Restaurant was held in June, and we had 14 people enjoy a delicious meal. June luncheons have been annual affairs to which we invite all the ladies of the church and at which we award Recognition Pins to church members who have served our church throughout the year in many ways. Last year we were unable to award the 2020 pins so we awarded pins for two years. *Karen VanDerlyn* and *Jane Sandulli* were our 2020 recipients, and *Cheryl Johnstone* and *Holly Norton* received for 2021. We are also collecting coins, your loose change, pennies, nickels, dimes and quarters all mount up. Put them in the collection plate.


Thank you for participating in these 2 programs. They make a difference financially, every little bit helps. Thank you.



Pastor Jenkins joined the ladies for lunch and they surprised him with a birthday cake, He certainly was surprised by their hospitality!








September is National Back to Church month and Pastor Jenkins invited
